### Anti-Crabby Cake

Cook time: 35 Min Prep time: 5Min Serves: Makes 9x13 pan

#### CAKE:

1 can crushed pineapple in 100% juice (large-20 oz can) do not drain

2 cups all purpose flour

1 ½ cups sugar

2 large eggs

2 tsp baking soda

#### FROSTING:

8 oz cream cheese, room temp

1 stick unsalted butter, room temp

2 cups powdered sugar

1tsp vanilla

2 Tbsp mild

#### DIRECTIONS;

1. preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2. Put all cake ingredients into a large mixing bowl and blend by hand to combine. No need to bust out the beaters for this one, but you can if you want to
3. Pour mixture into 9x13 glass pan. You do not need to grease, flour, spray. etc. Trust me. it comes out perfect without. Bake 30-40 minutes until just golden and baked through.
4. You'll want to frost the cake while still warm, so prepare your frosting as your cake bakes. You can frost when colled all the way also , but it is just easier to frost warmer. Simply add your frosting ingredients into a large bowl and beat until combined and smooth.
5. Spread the frosting on the warm cake ritght in the pan. Let cool, then refrigerate. Serve cold and enjoy!!
